September Home Sales Shine

Vancouver, BC. Real estate continued to lead BC's economy in September. The British Columbia Real Estate Association (BCREA) reports 8,436 homes sold on the Multiple Listing Service® (MLS®), worth well over \$2.2 billion—an increase of 46.43 per cent from September 2002.

Over 2,000 more homes sold in September compared to the same period last year—an increase of 32.1 per cent. Though economic conditions vary around the province, 11 of the 12 BC real estate boards reported improvements in both dollar volume and unit sales over September 2002. In northern BC, the market is improving slowly, after eight years of decline.

"For each of the last seven months, housing sales have exceeded \$2 billion," notes BCREA President David Herman. "This is tremendous for the provincial economy, considering that almost everyone who buys a home also buys furniture and appliances, does some renovations and uses legal and financial services. The impact is staggering."

Third quarter sales reached 26,676 units, worth nearly \$7 billion. In 2002, MLS® sales set a record with a value of over \$19 billion, and 2003 sales from January to September already total over \$18 billion.

"Real estate will clearly drive the economy into 2004 and beyond," says Herman. "There's no doubt that the current low interest rates are key to making housing accessible to British Columbians and appealing to investors."

Note to readers: Beginning with April 2003 residential MLS® sales data, totals will include the "residential – other" category from the Fraser Valley Real Estate Board and the Real Estate Board of Greater Vancouver, as is reported in The Canadian Real Estate Association's (CREA) residential sales data. The provincial sales totals reported by BCREA have been slightly lower than those released by CREA due to the omission of this category in those two board areas only.

The "residential – other" category includes houses with acreage, among other residential property types, and has always been included in the calculations of the other ten British Columbia boards.

Sales totals for 2002 and the first quarter of 2003 have been amended to reflect this change for comparison purposes.
